 Can I locate important physical features such as the Atlantic Coastal Plain, Great Plains, Continental Divide, the Great Basin, Death Valley, Gulf of Mexico, St. Lawrence River, Island of Hispaniola, Isthmus of Panama, and the Great Lakes in North and Central America?

Be able to recognize them on a map.

2. Why did some Native American groups form permanent villages while others moved around?

Some had to move to follow the food they needed to eat or because the weather changed at different times of the year.

3. How did the six different NA groups use the natural resources they had in their environments?

Trees for shelter, boats, fires, clothing, food (nuts, berries, fruit). Animals (buffalo, fish, deer, walrus, caribou) for food, clothing, blankets. Oceans/rivers for water, for fishing, hunting, etc. . .

4. Where were each of the six groups located? Can you locate these locations on a map?

Pawnee—Great Plains, Seminoles—Southeast (FL), Inuit—Arctic, Hopi—Southwest, Nez Perce—Plateau, Kwakiutl--Northwest
