Language Arts – Students wrote and then typed amazing Revolutionary "I Am" poems! They did their best to use their five senses to write descriptive poems. I am still meeting with each student to evaluate their current reading level and review their progress in writing. We have been working on the skills of finding details to support answers and drawing inferences from texts.

Math- We continued learning how to convert fractions to decimals, compare decimals, order decimals from least to greatest, and generate number patterns that follow a rule. **Students are enjoying Daily Brain Teasers and previews to 5th grade math.** Please remember e-class has many great links to practice math skills.

Social Studies- We enjoyed a performance called "Buttons for George Washington." This is the fascinating story of a brave Quaker spy, Lydia Darragh, who cleverly sent messages to General George Washington by sewing them inside buttons. Bottle Person projects are due on Monday! Students should be prepared to teach their classmates about their famous/ infamous Revolutionary individual.

<u>A Peek at Next Week</u>

I can...

Language Arts - write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly. – refer to details in a text to explain what the text says explicitly and when inferring.

Math – write, model and express fractions with denominators 10 or 100 as decimals.

- read, write, order, and compare place value of decimals to hundredths.

Social Studies - determine the significance of the following events in influencing the outcome of the American Revolution: Battles of Lexington and Concord, Battle of Bunker Hill, Valley Forge, Battle of Trenton Battle of Saratoga, Battle of Yorktown, and Battle of Kettle Creek.
