Language Arts – This week students finished writing and typing their Revolutionary War newspapers. Students completed biographies, editorials, and advertisements. We also read a fictional story called The Great Hodii and wrote about a time we created a "Win-Win" situation by helping ourselves while helping another person at the same time. We began reading the award winning, quirky novel, Holes, by Louis Sachar.

A Peek at Next Week

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#### I can...
