## Our PAW- Terrific Week in Review! It was a short week, but we still accomplished a lot!

**Language Arts** – This week we wrote about our winter break, and we also wrote some goals for 2016! We are working on a Mid-Year opinion writing piece and will finish our final copy next week.

**Math-** We jumped right back into our Fractions Unit with a review of already learned skills. Students are doing a great job reading word problems and using the right steps to solve them. Our students also took their Mid-Year Big 20 and Mid-Year Problem Solving tests. I am proud to report that all of our students have made tremendous strides since the beginning of 4<sup>th</sup> grade! Students should complete the rest of their Fractions 1 Study Guide over the weekend. Our test is on Tuesday.

**Social Studies-** We have been having a blast learning about the events that led to the Revolutionary War. Students are learning *first-hand* about the tyranny that led to uproar in the colonies over an issue that was to be a major cause of the Revolution: **taxation without representation**. I am imposing more and more taxes on our students every day. We are having debates over England's decision to tax the colonies to pay for the French and Indian War. We are discussing the advantages and disadvantages that each country had to win the war.

**Science-** We reviewed concepts in our Light Unit and began filling out our study guides. Our Light Test will be next Friday.
