Language Arts compare and contrast the point of view from which different stories are narrated, including the difference between first- and third-person narrations - improve my writing through editing & revising.

Math – make a line plot to display a data set of measurements in fractions of a unit (1/2, 1/4, 1/8)

- know relative sizes of measurement units within one system of units including km, m, cm; kg, g; lb, oz.; l, ml; hr, min, sec. Understand the relationship between gallons, cups, quarts, and pints.

Social Studies- describe territorial expansion with emphasis on the Louisiana Purchase, the Lewis and Clark expedition, and acquisitions of Texas (the Alamo and independence), Oregon (Oregon Trail), and California (Gold Rush and the development of mining towns).

Science - predict how changes in the environment affect a community of organisms within an ecosystem.
