Language Arts– Students learned that authors can choose to write their novels in different points of view. A Peek at Next Week

I can...

Language Arts -conduct short research projects that build knowledge through investigation of different aspects of a topic. - produce clear and coherent writing in which the development and organization are appropriate to task, purpose, and audience.

Math – apply the area and perimeter formulas for rectangles in real world and mathematical problems.

- know relative sizes of measurement units within one system of units including km, m, cm; kg, g; lb, oz.; l, ml; hr, min, sec.

Social Studies- describe territorial expansion with emphasis on the Louisiana Purchase, the Lewis and Clark expedition, and acquisitions of Texas (the Alamo and independence), Oregon (Oregon Trail), and California (Gold Rush and the development of mining towns).

Science - predict how changes in the environment affect a community of organisms within an ecosystem.
