Our PAW-rific Week In Review!

<u>Language Arts</u> — Students did a great job typing their Planet Research reports in APA format, including a bibliography! It took us three days, but we did it! Hooray! Next week, the students will present their research projects and teach their classmates all about their planet. We are almost finished reading our very exciting chapter book, <u>A Whole Nother Story</u>, where we are reviewing various story elements, such as setting, plot, theme, climax, and conflict.

<u>Math-</u> This week we practiced long division, order of operations, and estimating quotients. Ask your child the meaning of "Please Excuse My Dear Aunt Sally." If your child is struggling with division and multiplication facts, they should practice with Mega Math or flashcards.

<u>Social Studies</u>- This week we learned more about The Mayflower Compact and the Pilgrims' struggles in the New World. We also compared and contrasted the life of settlers in the New England Colonies and Southern Colonies. We played an exciting game of "Kahoot it!" to review for today's part one unit test. <u>Science-</u> Students created star mobiles and learned what causes seasons and day & night here on Earth. We also learned about the tools scientists use to learn about space. A Peek at Next Week

I can...

Language Arts – report on a topic in an organized manner, using appropriate facts and relevant, descriptive details to support main ideas or themes; speak clearly at an understandable pace

Math – find and use strategies to solve division problems - make sense in multi-step word problems and preserve in solving them.

Social Studies – compare and contrast life in the three regions of Colonial America: New England, Mid-Atlantic (Middle), and Southern colonies

Science – demonstrate how it is the earth's tilt and orbit around the sun rather than the earth's distance from the sun that causes seasonal changes
