Our PAW-rific Week In Review!

Language Arts – We began our Persuasive Writing unit by learning strategies to convince readers to believe in our own point of view. Students did a great job on their Bingo persuasive paragraph about our first permanent colony, Jamestown. "Was Jamestown a Success or a Failure?" We also reviewed simple and compound predicates, adjectives, and homophones.

<u>Math-</u> We reviewed for our Multiplication Test by creating arrays with snap cubes, modeling with area models, and problem solving. We had our first Division Minute on Thursday. If your child is struggling with division facts, they should practice with Mega Math or flashcards.

<u>Social Studies</u>- We are learning what it would be like if we lived in Colonial times. Students were amazed to find out children were not allowed to speak or sit at the dinner table! We also learned about the hardships of Jamestown and completed a virtual history lesson called The Jamestown Adventure.

<u>Science-</u> Students are loving our new Solar System and Beyond unit! We began our unit with an introduction to the sun, planets, and asteroid belt. We sang some fun songs and created posters of the planets. Ask your child the meaning of "My Very Excellent Mother Just Served Us Nachos!"
