Our PAW-rific Week In Review!

<u>Language Arts</u> – We continued our Persuasive Writing unit by writing opinion pieces on whether it would be better to live in Colonial Times or Present Times. Students used strategies in their writing to convince readers to believe their point of view. We also began our Informational Writing unit by beginning our research papers and learning how to cite sources for a bibliography.

<u>Math-</u> We practiced a lot of multi-digit multiplication and used various strategies to solve equations. A study guide for our Part 2 Test will come home on Monday. We had our second Division Minute on Friday. If your child is struggling with division facts, they should practice with Mega Math or flashcards.

<u>Social Studies</u>- We learned what life was like for the puritans and pilgrims who lived in the New England Colonies. Students learned that many of the New England colonists came to the new world for religious reasons, the land was rocky and rich with forests, the winters were harsh, and colonists were shipbuilders, fishers, merchants, and artisans.

<u>Science-</u> Students enjoyed working in groups in the media center to research a planet or the moon. Their mission was to use at least 3 sources and to record facts and details about their celestial body. Their research organizers should be filled with great information by now.

A Peek at Next Week

I can...
