

Study Guide for Colonial Test Part I

- ***Understand the following definitions and concepts:***

colony-a settlement set up by people far from their home country, but where they are ruled by their home country

democracy- rule by the people

Direct Democracy- people vote directly on laws

Representative Democracy- citizens vote on a representative who will vote on laws (mayors, governors, president, etc)

House of Burgesses- a representative government used in Virginia (This was the first representative government in the colonies)

Mayflower Compact- first document of rules and consequences written by the pilgrims on The Mayflower to explain how the Plymouth Colony should be run

plantation- very large farm where one main crop is grown for profit

artisan- a skilled craftsman (examples: seamstress, baker, blacksmith, cooper, goldsmith)

slave- person owned by and forced to work for another against his will

indentured servant- person who agrees to work for another person for about 5 to 7 years in exchange for passage to the colonies

Pilgrims- Wanted to **separate** themselves from Church of England. They came for religious freedom and settled in Plymouth. (First Thanksgiving)

Puritans- *Very strict* religious group who wanted to **purify** the Church of England. They came for religious freedom and settled in Massachusetts. Not tolerant of other religions

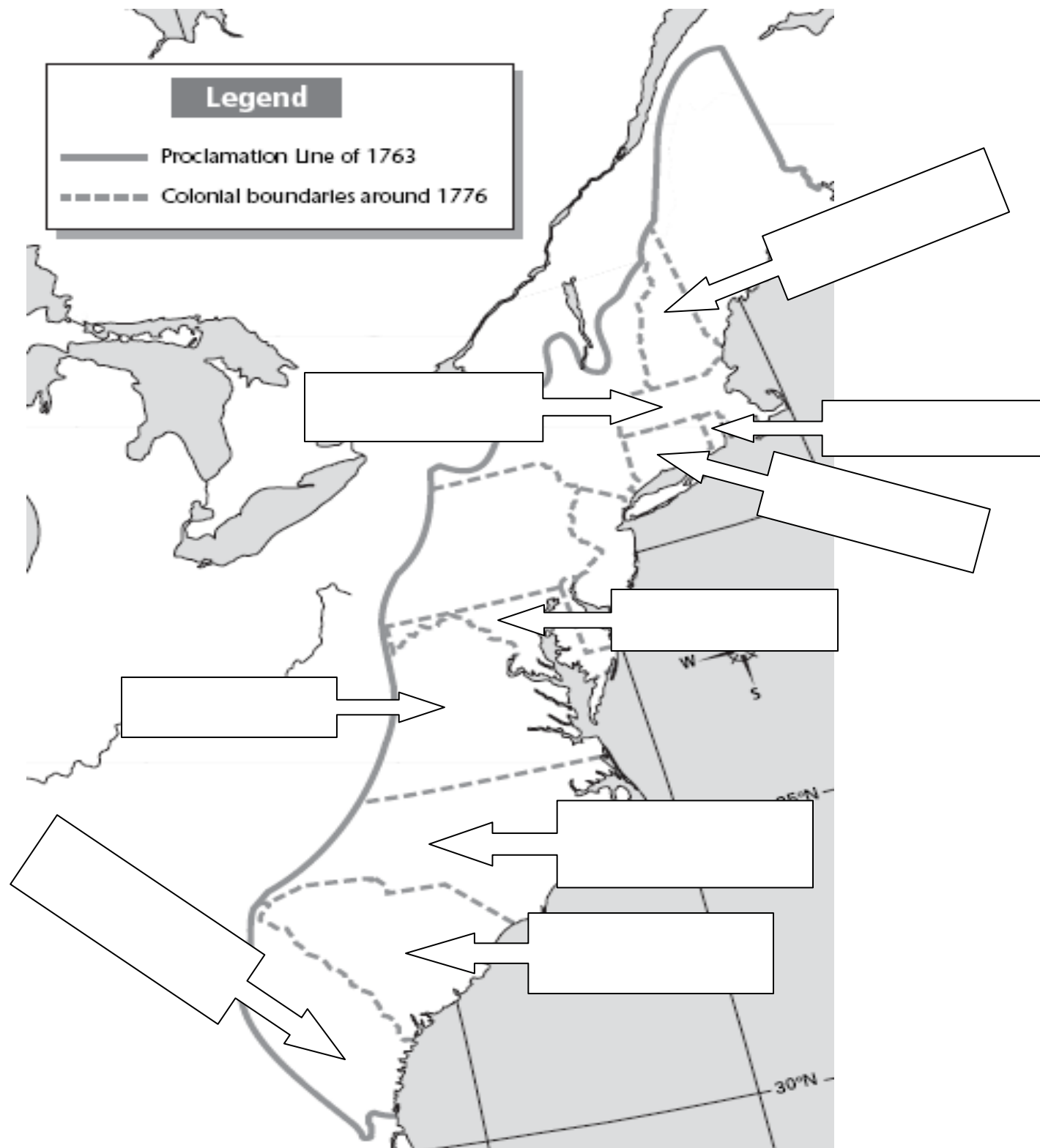
